



- Scotland's most famous architect, born in Glasgow
- Son of a police superintendent, 10 brothers and sisters.
- Married to and collaborated with artist Margaret Macdonald
- A radical, who did not follow tradition
- A man who lived a genuine artist's life: successes and failures.



WHY IS THE WILLOW SO SPECIAL?


 It is the only Mackintosh building that does the job it was originally designed to do (in 1903 it was a tearoom, in 2021 it is a tearoom!)
