Car lovers from all over Grampian are expected to attend one of the region's biggest car shows held at The National Trust for Scotland's Drum Castle.

On Sunday 29 July, Drum Castle will play host to a huge selection of some of the finest Jaguar vehicles owned in Britain - both old and new.

Now in its nineteenth year, the Annual Jaguar Classic Car Show, hosted by the Grampian Region of Jaguar Enthusiasts' Club (GRJEC) will showcase iconic Jaguars dating back as far as the 1950s, including renowned classics and modern favourites.
