National Trust for Scotland properties offers free entry across Edinburgh and the East

Two National Trust for Scotland sites in Edinburgh and the East are offering free entry to National Lottery players from 23rd November to 1st December 2019.

Gladstone's Land and The Georgian House in Edinburgh are just two of the hundreds of National Lottery funded venues and visitor attractions across Scotland saying #ThanksToYou to people who have raised money for good causes by buying a lottery ticket.

For one week, visitors can explore some of the most significant historic and cultural locations in Edinburgh and the East for free by showing any National Lottery ticket.

The National Trust for Scotland, which owns and cares for many of Scotland's most treasured heritage sites, has received more than £10.5 million in funding from the National Lottery Heritage Fund – and to say thank you, the conservation charity is offering free entry to National Lottery players.

"As a charity, the funding is crucial in helping the National Trust for Scotland continue educating, informing and entertaining visitors from across the globe with tales of Scotland's rich culture and heritage."
