Go Quackers at Barry Mill's Duck Race

Celebrate this May Bank Holiday Weekend differently and enjoy all the fun of the Duck Race Extravaganza at The National Trust for Scotland's Barry Mill.

As well as racing ducks, visitors can enjoy free admission to Barry Mill, a rare piece of living, working history where if the walls - graffitied with names of the characters who worked there - could speak, they'd tell tales of the Mill's technological and social heritage. Visitors can see the water powered wheel and enjoy the atmosphere of a rumbling building that works in harmony with nature.

Ciarán Quigley, Senior Assistant and Miller at Barry Mill said, "As well as enjoying the action of our ever popular duck races, attendees can visit the turning water mill, browse stalls in the craft village and enjoy a relaxing lunch or picnic in the grounds."

The event will take place on both Saturday 5 and Sunday 6 May, no booking necessary and ducks will be available for £2 each on the day. Races will take place between 11:30 - 3:30, approximately every 20 minutes.

As well as the duck races and free admission to the Mill, there will be face painting, food, refreshments and craft stalls on site.
