The assessor observed that RBBM 'more than' reached the 5 star standards, commenting specifically on how fantastic the staff are across the property and mentioning in particular that the new play area was 'great' and the quality of food on offer in the café is 'excellent'.

The accessor thought the Burns Cottage smallholding was a fantastic development, really enhancing the experience of visitors to the birthplace.
