Medieval camp bound for Brodie

Swooping falcons, circus spectacles and jolly jesters will give visitors a sample of medieval entertainment at the National Trust for Scotland's Brodie Castle near Forres on Saturday 17 and Sunday 18 August.

An encampment of entertainers will pitch up at the beautiful Morayshire estate for the weekend, ready to impress families from near and far with their fun demonstrations and performances.

Operations Manager James Dean said: "Brodie Castle has a very long history and the family were well-known for their hospitality and entertaining, so this event seems like a fitting addition to our summer celebrations."

Visitors can also enjoy a tour of the castle which dates back more than 400 years and spend some time meeting Scotland's biggest bunny sculpture at the Playful Garden, a unique multi-sensory play experience for children and adults that's home to a fascinating menagerie of characters inspired by the castle's quirky and colourful history.
