Aberdeen's best-loved castles and gardens announce outdoor theatre events

Some of Aberdeenshire's most spectacular castles and gardens are hosting a series of outdoor theatre and music performances this summer.

The programme of shows will include Shakespeare beneath the stars at Castle Fraser, Alice in Wonderland at Crathes Castle and live music performances, paying homage to stars including Dolly Parton and Johnny Cash, at Pitmedden Garden.

Families are invited to bring their blankets and chairs and take their seats in sun at day shows or under a canopy of stars at night, with Covid-19 safety measures and socially distancing also in place at each performance.

The shows are being hosted by the National Trust for Scotland and offer something for everyone, from Shakespearean classics to family favourites and musical nights.

Fans of Shakespeare will be able to catch a dazzling performance of The Tempest at Castle Fraser on 11 July. The Merry Wives of Windsor will arrive at Drum Castle with fast-paced drama and even quicker costume changes in this musical version of Shakespeare's most raucous comedy, while Henry V will be staged at Pitmedden Garden on Tuesday 17 August.

Families are also invited to bring their picnics for a fun evening performance of David Walliams' best-seller, Mr Stink on Thursday 8 July at Pitmedden.

For those looking for animal adventure this summer, families can help catch the evil wolf or sing along with Gub Gub the Pig. Little Red and The Big Bad Wolf are at Castle Fraser, the Further Adventures of Doctor Dolittle – Illyria is at Drum Castle and the Cheshire Cat will make an appearance at Crathes for a special one-off performance of Alice's Adventures in Wonderland.

Pitmedden Garden is also hosting a series of outdoor tribute shows including Abbamania and The Reclaimers on 6 and 7 August, respectively. The Girls' Night Out on Friday 13 August will feature performances from Simply Ariana, Spiceworld and Power of She, while country fans can enjoy Flavour of Country with Dolly Parton, Neil Diamond and Johnny Cash the following evening (Saturday 14 August).

Open-air theatre goers are encouraged to bring blankets, rugs and picnics along to enjoy the alfresco entertainment. All events can be booked through each of the individual properties on the National Trust for Scotland website at www.nts.org.uk
