Autumnal activities at historic Brodick

There's a fruitful autumn planned at the National Trust for Scotland's Brodick Castle, as the historic estate hosts a series of fun, outdoor family events all inspired by the castle's long and intriguing history.

Operations Manager Jared Bowers said:

"With such a long history and its stunning location, Brodick Castle has so much to discover this Autumn. We hope that visitors come to uncover more about this special place and the work our charity does to protect it, for the love of Scotland."

From 14 – 21 October, follow the scarecrow trail in the woods, go on a scavenger hunt adventure in the play park or carve a pumpkin at the Autumn at Brodick Event. These family activities run daily 11am until 4pm. Charges apply.

Events take a spooky turn as Halloween approaches – the castle's long history has inspired ghost trails and tours, taking place on Saturday 27 and Sunday 28 October from 11am - 4pm. Take a wander through the woods to a spooky soundtrack and keep an eye out for some scary surprises.

Then join the team on Halloween for the Haunted Manor - this evening experience through the woods is not for the faint-hearted. This interactive experience has live actors, elaborate set designs and scary music – are you brave enough? Tickets for this event are limited and booking is recommended.
