- Quirky silver earrings and cufflinks take their design inspiration from the gable end of the Helensburgh landmark.
- Johnston's of Elgin have created a luxurious and striking range of scarves which echoes the style and palettes of the house's bespoke interiors.
- Bringing the range bang up-to-date is the statement necklace and earrings created. The chainmail design echoes the Box which is being built to protect the house from the ravages of the West Coast elements.
