Falkland Palace seen from new perspective

Work by award-winning Fife artist Pat Beveridge, Falkland Palace's current 'Palace Artist' will go on display at the property this week after Covid caused the delay of the exhibition by a year.

The Glenrothes-based artist's show Palace Perspectives will run from 28 July to 8 August at the property, which is looked after by conservation charity the National Trust for Scotland.

Drawing inspiration from the Palace grounds, buildings and history, Pat works mainly in acrylic, but also "paints" with repurposed and hand-dyed fabrics and stitch. She works with layers, which consist of washes or blocks of colour in paint or fabric. These are built up gradually and sometimes erased or obscured.

Jerome Chevet, Visitor Services Manager at Falkland Palace said: "Palace Perspectives is the culmination of over a year's work in and around the Palace, which had to be postponed last year when the pandemic struck. The team here are so excited to welcome Pat back to the Palace to display her beautiful work."

The exhibition of Pat's work will be held in the Education Room within the Palace and visitors will be able to see it at the end of their Palace tour or anytime whilst in the garden. The exhibition runs Wednesdays to Sundays, 11am-4.30pm from 28th of July until 8th of August and the pieces are available to buy.
