STEP BACK IN TIME TO DISCOVER ABERDEENSHIRE'S PAST WITH NATIONAL TRUST FOR SCOTLAND

- Archaeology, battle re-enactments, history and pirate themed events taking place across Aberdeenshire
- Visitors invited to immerse themselves in history at National Trust for Scotland properties, including Castle Fraser and Leith Hall

Dramatic battle re-enactments, swashbuckling pirates and the discovery of ancient artefacts are some of the highlights on offer as the National Trust for Scotland hosts a variety of different history themed events across the North East this summer and beyond.

The conservation charity which cares for Castle Fraser, at Sauchen and Leith Hall, near Huntly, is encouraging visitors to take a step back in time and explore the history of its properties through a series of activities including battle re-enactments, weapon demonstrations, archaeological excavations and treasure hunts taking place in August and September.

Leith Hall welcomes local author Carol Ann, a descendant of the infamous pirates Captain 'Calico' Jack Rackham and Anne Bonny, for a weekend of pirate tales and treasure trails from 12 – 13 Aug, that will capture the imagination of young ones, with stories from her forthcoming book, Macgregor Island, alongside a treasure hunt, obstacle course and crafts. In September, *The Jacobites are Coming*, will see actors from Alan Breck's Volunteer Regiment in period costume descend on Leith Hall to recreate skirmishes from the Forty-Five Uprising! The grounds will host an 18th century soldier encampments with crafts and drill training for young volunteers.

Castle Fraser will hold History Weekend and Archaeology Week from 19 August that will feature 15th century re-enactors, weapon displays as well as archaeology digs that will tell the story of the castle and its owners the Fraser family. National Trust for Scotland members can access each event for free, with tickets available to book online or purchased at each property on the day.

Scotland's largest conservation charity, which protects and shares the country's natural, cultural and historical heritage now and for future generations, hopes the history focused events will capture the imagination, perfect for history enthusiasts and families as the school holidays draw to a close and for September weekend.

There is something for everyone with battle re-enactments, weapon demonstrations, treasure hunts and archaeological excavations alongside painting and rural crafts for our younger visitors. Events like Castle Fraser's History Weekend and Archaeology Week and Leith Hall's Pirates and Jacobite Uprising re-enactment support our vision to provide inspiring heritage visitor experiences and contribute to our vision to share nature, beauty and heritage with everyone, as outlined in our strategy, launched in 2022. The swashbuckling adventures of pirates will keep kids entertained this summer with a host of pirate themed activities taking place to shiver their timbers, with a treasure hunt around the pond walk, obstacle courses and a variety of crafts on offer. Author Carol Ann will join in the fun and talk about her links to infamous pirates Captain 'Calico' Jack Rackham and Anne Bonny, who sailed the Caribbean seas in the 1700s, and share extracts from her forthcoming book, Macgregor Island, released in 2024.

History weekend kicks off with re-enactors from Northern Alliance who will recreate a 15th century encampment at Castle Fraser, one of Scotland's largest tower houses. With live sword and archery displays, visitors will be able to get up close to inspect the arms and armour on show, with the unique opportunity to see how the property's sword collection is conserved and cared for. Garden tours will take place from 1pm each day to discover the history of the castle's gardens and landscape alongside a variety of different children's activities.

Join the National Trust for Scotland's archaeology team to uncover the history of Castle Fraser's past. The team returns to the castle after unearthing two large stone walls beneath the front lawn last year to expand the dig to see what else they can discover. Live archaeological digs will be taking place within the castle's grounds and visitors have the chance to get involved and learn from the Trust's experts – no experience is necessary. Travel back in time to the 18th century to explore events surrounding the Battle of Prestonpans – a Jacobite victory on 21st September 1745. Discover more about this fascinating skirmish in which Leith Hall's own Jacobite, the towering 7'2" Andrew Hay fought, alongside 7 other members of the Leith family in the Jacobite Rising of 1745. Opposing Jacobite and Redcoat forces will be setting up encampments in the grounds where visitors can experience camp life as a soldier, witness weaponry and artillery demonstrations, volunteer for drill display or join lots of the other more activities on offer.
