
GANNET



We look after the world's largest gannet colony at St Kilda World Heritage Site. Gannets dive into the water at speeds of up to 60mph to catch their fish!






PUFFIN


Puffins nest in special burrows on the clifftops on Staffa, and sometimes even join visitors for a picnic!







LIGHTHOUSE










SALMON

Harbour seals are expert swimmers and divers. Look out for their round heads and dog-like noses poking out of the water at Inverewe.



With their long graceful necks and white feathers, swans are easy to spot gliding across many ponds, rivers and lochs in our care.







DOLPHINS



These playful mammals chat to each other using a series of clicks and whistles. We work hard to protect their marine habitats at our coastal places.






GREATSKUA







GUILLEMOT




